


Crosswalks at McKenzie Elementary



Drill practices

Each month throughout the school year, we practice a different drill in the school. There are a variety of drills that we practice and all are designed to ensure student safety in the event of an emergency. We practice fire and earthquake drills as well as lockdown and hold and secure drills. As with anything, the more we practice the better we will be at completing it successfully. This week we practiced a lockdown drill. A lockdown drill prepares students and staff in the event of an intruder in the school. In light of recent tragedies in Edmonton and Las Vegas, we kept our lockdown drill very routine and emphasized the process rather than the reasons we may have a lockdown. Our school police liaison officer and several other members of the Saanich Police department attended our drill and were happy with the process we went through.

At our November PAC meeting, Wednesday November 8, 6:00 - 8:00 we will be hosting a guest speaker. Julie-Anne Richards frequently provides both parent education and teacher /administrator training sessions throughout British Columbia, <u>specializing in the area of child/youth anxiety</u>.
