As of Wednesday afternoon we have raised \$1495 for the Heart and Stroke Foundation! Great work McKenzie Community!!


HOBIYEE:

Hobiyee is the Nisga'a new year celebrated every February or March. It signifies the emergence of the first crescent moon and begins the month Buxw-laks. Hobiyee comes from the phrase "Hobixis hee!" "meaning the "moon is in the shape of the hoobix". The hoobix is the bowl of the Nisga'a wooden spoon. Hobiyee thus signifies the potential for an abundant harvest (or filled spoon) if the crescent moon's edges point upward.



At Hobiyee, if the crescent moon is seen with its edges pointing upwards, it foretells an abundant year of salmon, oolichans (saak), berries and various other foods. The months Buxw-laks and Xsaak indicate the end of the winter and the emergence of oolicahans in the rivers, the first food supply to arrive when winter resources were depleted.
