HEAD LICE:

There have been a few cases of head lice reported at McKenzie School recently. Head lice are common, especially among children between the ages of 3 to 12. Head lice do not spread any diseases, but itching can develop in infested individuals. Personal hygiene or cleanliness in the home, school, or community has nothing to do with getting head lice. Anyone who has hair can get head lice.

CHICKEN POX:

We have been informed that there have been a couple of cases of chickenpox at the school. Chickenpox is an infection caused by the varicella-zoster virus. It spreads easily through the air when an infected person coughs or sneezes. You can become infected when you breathe in this air or touch contaminated surfaces. The virus may spread through contact with an infected person's saliva such as by sharing food or drinks. It also spreads through contact with the fluid from chickenpox blisters. Children with chickenpox can have on average 350 red, itchy blisters. Infection in newborns, teenagers, adults, pregnant women and those with weakened immune systems is more severe. For some people, the virus can become active again later in life and cause a painful rash called shingles. 
